TERMS USED:

Bloom: an individual flower, one to a stem with no buds showing colour.

Stem: may carry one or more flowers and buds, and may be branched

Spike: any upright stem with several flowers, usually with short pedicles-eg Gladioli, Snapdragon

Spray: a portion of the plant with a number of flowers or buds on one stem

CUT FLOWERS

All flowers are to be fresh unless otherwise specified, and are to be grown by the exhibitor. Some prizes sponsored in part by Gerald & Shirley Shortt

2. Bachelor Buttons, 5 blooms
3. Calendula, 3 blooms

6. Chrysanthemums, 3 sprays, one colour
7. Dahlia, 1 bloom, larger than 6" in diameter
8. Dahlia, 1 bloom, 4"-6" in diameter
9. Dahlia, 3 blooms, less than 4" in diameter
10. Dahlia, cactus, 1 bloom

- 65. Country Treasures-Arrangement of fresh Weeds from fields and roadsides
- 66. Container of gladioli – at least 5 spikes
- 67. Display of roses - at least 5 blooms
- 68. Large basket or container of cut flowers - one sided view
- 69. Soups On-arrangement in a soup can (label left on)
- 70. Green Living, arrangement using only greenery and foliage
- 71. Gourmet Kitchen-an arrangement of herbs in a measuring cup-minimum 2 varieties of herbs
- 72. Colours of the Rainbow-an arrangement using a minimum of 6 different colours
- 73. Celebrate Canada - arrangement of red and white flowers
- 74. Good Morning Sunshine – an arrangement in a coffee mug
- 75. Lonesome Beauty-single bloom or stem with other plant material
- 76. Small is Beautiful-miniature arrangement-not to exceed 5" in any direction including container
